



# PRESENTATION AND PUBLICATION POLICY

The Resilience Week Leadership is delighted that your paper has been accepted for presentation. This note is designed to explain the different methods for presentations.

## PRESENTATIONS

Authors attending one of the Resilience Week symposia will present their work in either an oral or a poster session format.

### Oral Presentations

Each author will have a total of 15 minutes (10 minute presentation, 5 minute Q&A) to present their contribution and answer questions. (If a track/session chair requests a work in progress presentation, only 5 minutes is allotted.) A basic rule of thumb is 2 minutes/slide. The session chairperson(s) will help ensure the smooth flow of presentations. A video projector and screen will be provided, but a computer *will not* be provided. Authors must arrive well before their session to discuss presentation logistics with their session chair. Wi-Fi access will be provided in the symposium area. Presentations should use the presentation template available on the symposium webpage.

### Works in Progress and Industry Presentations

Similar to above, but a lesser time is normally allotted for works in progress and for lightning presentations, as defined by the symposium chair(s).

### Poster Session Presentations

Print your poster and bring it with you to the conference venue. We do not collect posters before or after the event. The displayable poster area is 4 feet by 4 feet. We strongly suggest a poster size of 3 feet x 4 feet (portrait layout) as you will be sharing the poster stand with other authors. Poster stands and tacks for mounting will be provided at the venue. Each poster presentation must have at least one author present during at the poster session hours. AV equipment is not permitted in the poster session area and no electricity is available in the poster area. Please remove your poster at the end of your session or it may be discarded. You will be sent specifics of your poster session day/time.

## INTERNET/PROCEEDINGS PUBLICATION

An electronic copy of the ISRCs proceedings will be provided to all symposium participants via the symposium website, accessed through your registration password. After the symposium, any plenary/keynote presentations and videos will be posted on the associated Resilience Week symposium website.
